Prince Albert Forklift License - In North America, getting a forklift license or forklift certification involves hands-on and classroom training. Regulatory control over training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of federal, state and provincial groups. Operators can acquire a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. Regardless, regulatory requirements must be met. Recertification is needed every two to three years.

Lift trucks are powered industrial trucks which come along with various alternatives, like for instance stand-up and sit-down. There are various types and sizes of forklift suitable for different industrial uses. Operator training programs are usually individualized to address the certain uses and types for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down lift truck inside a warehouse surroundings would not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up lift truck in a shipyard. The different lift trucks and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machinery and businesses. Regulatory standards, therefore, have a tendency not to focus on detailed course requirements but instead on the outcome of individual training programs.

Employer-provided, on-the-job training is the most common way for operators to obtain their forklift license or certification. This particular method of certification needs the employer to provide classroom sessions and practical training on equipment in the workplace. Employers may choose to train staff on each and every kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all machinery combined. The program incorporates lift truck operation methods, lift truck maintenance, safety procedures and company policies. Subject matters particular to the worksite, like for instance dangerous conditions or materials, must be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and utilize every type of forklift on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor normally needs an on-site component together with hands-on practice.

Usually, a certification provided by an employer would not transfer from the existing employer to the next employer. Receiving a lift truck license through employer-provided training enables the operator to operate a lift truck for that particular employer only.

The most significant factor of lift truck license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements differ from one kind of machine to another. Safety issues differ from industry to industry and from employer to employer. Both third-party providers and employer-provided training may have to deal with extra requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like in marine and offshore operations.
